## **The role of the mother, the family and group care in early childhood**

**Mona Bekkhus (University of Oslo)**

### Part I: The role of the mother and family

Children growing up in disharmonious families with anxious or depressed mothers are at risk for emotional and behavioural difficulties. There is uncertainty over whether the link between maternal anxiety/depression and emotional disturbance in the children reflects postnatal environmental mediation or the effects of prenatal exposure.

### Part II : The role of non-maternal care

Some researchers have suggested developmental effects of non-maternal care increase disruptive behaviour in children, while others have found protective effects of non-maternal care in at-risk children. Thus non-maternal care may not work the same way in all societies.
